

Return to School in September 2020

Does my child have to attend school in September?

Yes, from Thursday 3rd September all children **must** return to school.

How will you keep my child safe?

We will be putting measures in with some details below to keep our community as safe as possible.

What will my child wear?

Full school uniform must be worn each day. Children must bring a coat. Bags or other items other than book bags **must not** be brought between school and home.

Can I call into the school office to drop something off or meet my child's teacher?

If you need to pay any monies then please wait on the marked lines and social distance. Please call the office to arrange a telephone appointment if you need to speak to your child's class teacher

NO pencil cases or personal items to be brought into school. All equipment will be provided by school

Wear your PE kit to school on your PE day. PLAIN Navy shorts/jogging bottoms/leggings and PE t-shirt to be worn.
Trainers and plain navy sweatshirt

All children will be provided with their own water bottle that will be kept in school.

If you bring a packed lunch please make sure it is in a wipeable box. No bags please

Children can arrive from 8.40am at their designated door and go straight to class.
ALL children must be in school by 8.55am

At the end of the day you can collect your child from their designated area on the playground.

All children must arrive and be collected on time.

Each class will form its own bubble.
As far as possible, these bubbles will not mix.

School response if a child displays symptoms during school time.

Concern raised by the child themselves or by an adult supervising.

Person is isolated immediately. Child's parents will be contacted.

Child **must** be collected **immediately** from school.

Mandatory 7 days of self-isolation.

Negative Test Result:

The child must complete the compulsory 7 days self-isolation.
The rest of the bubble can return to school as usual.

Negative test

Parents **MUST** inform school of test outcome **immediately**.

Test **MUST** be arranged and **must** take place.

All families must engage with the Test and Trace process.

Positive test

Positive Test Result: The child must complete the compulsory 7 days self-isolation from the date of the test.
The rest of the bubble will close and all pupils in this bubble will need to undertake 14 days of compulsory self-isolation. If children develop symptoms in this time, they must be tested. School must be informed of the test outcome.
If a result is received on a weekend, families **must inform school by 9am on the Monday morning**.

What if I am contacted by NHS Test and Trace?

If you are contacted on a weekend, inform school **by 9am** on the Monday morning.

Other FAQs

Will there be a breakfast club?

Yes. You must book your child in as staff need to make sure there are enough tables and space to accommodate the children. It will be £1 a day

Will my child need their book bag?

Yes. Your child will be bringing reading books home.

My child has medication. How do I arrange for this to be taken in school time?

If medication requires 3 or more doses during the day, please call ahead to the office on 01254 698301 to arrange this with Mrs Bolton.

Will my child be in a class with their peers?

Yes, we currently plan that year groups will be taught together in their classrooms. Siblings will be taught within their own year groups.

Will children social distance in school?

Children within the same bubble will be in their class groups. Guidance states that children within the bubble may not be able to distance socially. Adults will distance from children as much as possible.
